

POLICY ON RE-ATTEMPTING THE BC JURISPRUDENCE EXAMINATION

In order to pass the College of Midwives of British Columbia (CMBC) Jurisprudence Examination (BC Exam), a candidate must achieve a mark of 78% or higher.

Exam Failure and Re-attempting

A mark below 78% indicates a fail of the BC Exam.

If a candidate fails the BC Exam, the candidate is entitled to two further opportunities to attempt the exam. The candidate may schedule their first re-attempt of the exam at the earliest two weeks from the date the initial exam results are received. If the candidate fails the second attempt of the exam, the third and final re-attempt may take place at the earliest three months from the date the results from the second attempt are received.

Should a candidate fail the BC Exam on the third and final attempt, the candidate will not meet the requirements for registration.
